Soirbheas had a busy Autumn hosting a very successful Green Living Day to celebrate the launch of the Local Energy Plan for Drumnadrochit and a Hard to Treat Homes session for those with older properties in partnership with Home Energy Scotland.

With help from Abriachan Forest Trust pupils from Balnain Primary School took centre stage with their inspiring plastic reduction puppet show at the Green Living day. All those that attended the day received useful advice and support on energy saving, recycling, food waste, electric bikes and more.



Further to the development of the Drumnadrochit Local Energy Plan a local Energy Group has been formed to take forward actions to help address energy efficiency, energy generation, transport and smart energy systems in our community.

A number of projects are already underway including a transport feasibility study and an improved heating scheme for the care centre. We are seeking enthusiastic individuals that are keen to join the Energy Group.

Grant Deadlines

In 2018 the Glen Urquhart Childcare Centre was awarded £9,600 for outdoor play equipment. Audrey Maclennan from the Centre stated 'We were thrilled to have received funding from Soirbheas. The climbing



frame has been a massive hit with our children. It was the most wonderful Christmas present encouraging everyone outside in the colder weather'.

Since 2014 seventy two grants valuing a total of over

£170,000 have now been awarded, benefiting 1000's of people living in Strathglass and Glen Urquhart. Throughout the year the Tier 1 (up to £500) grant programme will remain open. The Tier 2 (£501 to £10,000) deadlines for 2019 are: 4th April, 15th August & 21st November. Tier 3 (£10,001 – £30,000) has a two stage application process, with the first round closing dates in 2019 being 7th March & 19th September subject to available funding.

Support for local businesses - our Apprenticeship Scheme aims to encourage local employers to take on a modern apprentice, funding is available to support salary costs for up to 3 years. The next closing date for applications is 2nd May.




Have you heard about Oil Clubs?

Many of you will rely on oil as a heating fuel. As prices have been rising, the good news is that there are savings to be had by joining an Oil Club. CAB published a report in 2018 and it suggests Highland residents join together in creating and joining oil-buying clubs, with the aim of making the purchasing of oil cheaper, estimating savings between 6% - 20%.
